Dear Mr. DeRosa:

This letter is in response to a recent request concerning an extension of time for or the validity of the above noted Treatment Works Approval (TWA). Please be advised that the Permit Extension Act of 2008 (PEA) signed by Governor Corzine on January 18, 2010 suspends the running of the period of approval for certain TWA permits that expired or are scheduled to expire between January 1, 2007 and December 31, 2012 until January 1, 2013. After this date the clock starts running again. However, the tolling provided for in the PEA shall not extend the TWA for more than six months beyond the conclusion of the extension period. Hence, permits expiring between January 1, 2007 and June 30, 2007 are entitled to an additional 6 years, while permits expiring between July 1, 2007 and December 31, 2012 will have a new expiration date of June 30, 2013.

In order for the period of approval of a TWA permit to be suspended for the extension period under the PEA, all of the following conditions must be met:

- 1) The project site is not located in an environmentally sensitive area as defined in the PEA, and;
- 2) The permit is not specifically revoked or suspended by the Department pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:14A-22.11, et seq..

The Department has determined that the project associated with the TWA No. 05-0096a is not located in an environmentally sensitive area as defined in the PEA. Therefore, if all other conditions have been met, the running of the period of approval of your permit is automatically suspended and tolled pursuant to the PEA. The new expiration date for the above referenced permit is June 30, 2013.

Please be advised that the Department will continue to process any unused one-year time extension requests in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:14A-22.12 after the PEA has expired. A request for an extension of time must be submitted to the Department prior to the permit's expiration date and shall include the following:

- 1) A written request from the applicant, and;
- 2) A copy of the referenced permit, and;
- 3) An appropriate fee.

The Department will make the determination on whether to grant the time extension based upon the circumstances that exist at the time the request is made.
